**Is there a training pre-requisite to attend?** There is no special training required for you to attend camp with your son. However, the BALOO (for Tiger, Wolf, Bear parents) and IOLS (Webelos) would be very helpful for this weekend. Safety, cooking, proper equipment, rules and more are part of the training courses.

# WEBELOREE

1. **EMERGENCIES:** First Aid is available 24 hrs in administrative center. Everyone that attends camp must have a current 2011 health form, part A & B. completed and left with the nurse. All injuries requiring more than a Band-Aid must be reported to the First Aid Station.
2. **LEAVE NO TRACE.** Pack it in, Pack it out. No garbage service at camp. Dumpsters are not available for use by campers. Campsite check will be required for checkout.
3. **WATER & KYBOS USE:** Please use the proper etiquette and keep the facilities clean. Abuse of the sanitation facilities will not be tolerated. Do not dump garbage or grey water into the latrines, (kybos) or porta potties. Do not wash dishes under fresh water spigot. Bring water containers to transport water to your site.
4. **CAMPFIRES:** Are to be in designated campfire rings with water present during any fires. Bring your own firewood.
5. **PARKING:** is first come, first parked. Parking is limited. Please carpool. **NO VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOWED IN CAMPSITE.** Special needs can be accommodated with advance notice. Do not leave any valuables in your car.
6. **SHOWERS & SAFE SCOUTING:** Observe safe scouting rules at all times. No adults may use any scout designated facility. Scouts use the buddy system.
7. **LIQUID FUEL:** All liquid fuel is to be stored by the Adult Leaders in each unit. For safety reasons, Scouts must not store fuel.
8. **CONDUCT BY ALL ATTENDING CAMP:**  
The Scout Law is the Law of the Camp. At all times. A scout is:  
~ trustworthy ~ loyal ~ helpful ~ friendly ~ courteous ~ kind ~  
obedient ~ cheerful ~ thrifty ~ brave ~ clean ~ reverent
9. **UNIFORMS:** Scout shirt, shorts / pants, belt, socks, unit neckerchief / hat.  
To be worn at opening ceremony, flag ceremonies, closing ceremonies.



# WEBELOREE

1. **MEMBERSHIP** All participants of the Camporee must be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America. Open to all Boy Scouts, Varsity, Venture Patrol Scouts, Venture Crews and Webelos & Bear Dens.
2. **TWO-DEEP LEADERSHIP** All Boy Scout units attending the Camporee must comply with the BSA policy requiring that "two registered adult leaders or adult and a parent of a participating Scout, one of whom must be at least 21 years of age or older, are required for all trips and outings". Cub Scouts see Camporee policy on website.
3. **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES/TOBACCO PRODUCTS** Alcoholic beverages are NOT permitted at a Scouting function. Anyone found possessing or consuming alcoholic beverages will be required to leave the Camp. Tobacco use is in accordance with BSA guidelines. For the purposes of the Camporee, all tobacco use is prohibited for scouts throughout the camp. Should adult leaders feel the need to partake of tobacco, they must do so off of the camp property.
4. **NON-SCOUTING EQUIPMENT** Guns, sheath knives and other such equipment not accepted by Scouting are prohibited. Any equipment of this kind will be confiscated and returned to adult leader upon check-out. Fireworks are prohibited as well. We are not responsible for lost personal electronic equipment (iPods, cell phones, etc.).
5. **CRITTERS AND PLANTS** Be prepared to defend yourselves against wildlife & poisonous plants. Bring your personal first aid kits for temporary treatment. All Troops should have a large, properly labeled and visible First Aid kit available in their campsites at all times during the Camporee.
6. **WEATHER** Everyone must be fully prepared for conditions at this time of year. Temperature ranges over the weekends could be quite cold to quite warm. Scouts are encouraged to bring necessary clothing to be as comfortable as possible at both of these extremes. Appropriate personal rain protection is also an excellent idea, as it has been known to (occasionally) rain during Scouting events in the past.
7. **FIRST AID** There will be a First Aid station staffed 24 hours per day for any person needing assistance. The First Aid Station will be located at the Administrative Center. <http://auroracamporee.com/index.html>



# WEBELOREE

**In order to maintain Ensign Ranch's safe, wholesome family atmosphere, each guest using the property will be expected to uphold the following standards and rules:**

- ◆ **NO DOGS** are allowed, not even if kept in cars.
- ◆ Absolutely **NO ALCOHOL** is allowed. (Those who bring alcohol will be asked to leave.)
- ◆ **NO SMOKING, TOBACCO, TEA OR COFFEE.** They are not permitted to be used while on the property.
- ◆ Males and females must **SLEEP** in **SEPARATE** rooms or areas **UNLESS MARRIED.**
- ◆ **MODEST DRESS** – Women and girls must wear one piece swimsuits or modest tankinis. **NO** Halter-tops, bikinis, or short shorts are allowed. Men and boys must wear modest swimming trunks that are not tight fitting.
- ◆ **NO FIREARMS.** The only exception is if it is to be used on the rifle range with **advance** approval from the manager.
- ◆ **NO HUNTING** of any kind is allowed.
- ◆ **NO FIREWORKS or EXPLOSIVE DEVICES** of any kind are permitted; not even on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July.
- ◆ Lake **FISHING** is by Ensign Ranch **PERMIT ONLY.** Permits are issued at either the ranch office or the Hitchin' Post. Both Big Creek and the Yakima River are governed by Washington State Fishing Regulations.
- ◆ **CAMPFIRES** must be **CONTAINED** in existing, designated fire-pits, and **FULLY EXTINGUISHED** whenever the campsite is unoccupied or vacated. Keep at least one five-gallon bucket of water and a shovel beside each fire-pit. During the dry season, please pay special attention to the posted fire warnings and regulations.
- ◆ Notify the management of any **ACCIDENT or INJURY.**
- ◆ **DRIVE SLOWLY and CAUTIOUSLY** and obey speed limits. Riding on the outside of a vehicle, or operating a vehicle without a license is strictly forbidden.
- ◆ **DO NOT PARK ON ROADWAYS.** Keep roads clear for emergency vehicle access.
- ◆ Yield the **RIGHT-OF-WAY TO PEOPLE AND HORSES.** If, while driving, you encounter an oncoming trail ride, pull off the road immediately if possible and / or stop your engine until the horses have passed you at least 100ft. If you happen to come up behind a trail ride, do **not** approach the horses with your vehicle! Stay back at least 100ft, and follow the signals given by the wranglers who ride the first and last horses in the line. **NEVER** honk your horn or attempt to get close to a horse from your vehicle window.
- ◆ **NO OFF-ROAD VEHICLES:** 4-wheelers, motorcycles or snowmobiles are **NOT** allowed.
- ◆ Always treat others with **RESPECT** (language, music, voices, noise, etc.). **QUIET TIME** is from **11 PM to 7 AM.**
- ◆ **LEAVE THE AREA YOU HAVE USED AS CLEAN, OR CLEANER, THAN YOU FOUND IT.** Upon arrival, if any room or area is not in satisfactory condition, **PLEASE** notify the management immediately.
- ◆ **DO NOT ATTRACT OR FEED WILDLIFE.** Campers should take precautions against attracting wildlife by properly preparing, storing, and disposing of food. Keep food and bait in tightly covered containers and store them inside your vehicle, especially at night. **NEVER** store food in an area where you sleep.
- ◆ Always treat the ranch **PROPERTY** and **ENVIRONMENT** with **CARE AND RESPECT.**
- ◆ Keep the **SABBATH DAY** holy. All facilities are **closed** on the Sabbath, and recreational activities are prohibited. Sunday meetings are available at Cle Elum Branch, Columbia Ave. at 4<sup>th</sup> Street – 10:00 a.m. (Come as you are.)
